

To the Tempe Community at Large:

One of the most public roles of the Tempe Community Council (TCC) for the past 28 years has been to distribute human services funds on behalf of the City of Tempe. It has been my privilege this year to Chair this well regarded process, known as Agency Review.

What makes this process a truly unique community effort, and more than purely a grant cycle, is that TCC mobilizes interested volunteers, who work and/or live in Tempe, to bring Agency Review that human element. For Fiscal Year (FY) 2013/2014, TCC worked with 48 volunteers, who dedicated an estimated 20 hours each, over a four-month period, to reading human service proposals, evaluating them, interviewing those agencies, and finally making funding recommendations to the City Council. This process is arduous, eye-opening, complex, and completely rewarding for everyone involved.

Agency Review funds come from the City of Tempe General Revenue Fund, Federal Community Development Block Grants, and water utility customer donations through Tempe's Help to Others (H2O). The total funds recommended for distribution this year are close to \$968,000, and will be allocated to 27 agencies Valley-wide with 40 programs serving Tempe clients. Those services include programs for our youth, seniors, those with disabilities, the working poor, survivors of domestic violence, and the homeless.

I'd like to thank those volunteers who dedicated their time and treasured insight to this process, as well as the TCC staff who assembled all of the information and coordinated the process. Together we make an impact. Together we care.



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

**Program Summary:** This program "offers single homeless men from Tempe the opportunity to recover their lives in a safe and supportive shelter environment."

  - This program has a great track record- 80% of clients do not return to program
  - This program serves the working homeless population (70% are employed)
  - This program has a valuable education component
  - This program works well with referral agencies to run at capacity
  - This agency is well run and skilled at fundraising
  - This shelter is not in Tempe, but is relatively close to Tempe border
  - This program is one of the few that serves young men that age out of the foster care system
  - This program is successful in transitioning clients out in fewer days than the maximum allowed (113 days v. 120 allowed)

- This program prevents youth from entering the court system
- This program does extensive follow up with clients at 10/20/ 30 days after initial visit
- While this facility is not located in Tempe is it close to the border and easily accessible
- This agency is a valuable partner with a longs history in the community and delivers a wide range of services
- This program addresses the needs of the top priority population identified in the survey (youth)
- This program has an impressive success rate with 84% of clients not returning

I.REASONS TO FUND

- This program is the only provider of emergency shelter services within Tempe boundaries
- This program collaborates with Tempe's faith community to achieve a common goal
- This program involves volunteers from throughout Tempe in an activity that builds compassion and support for homeless individuals
- This program leverages in-kind contributions for the hard costs (food, housing, showers, etc.) from the faith community partners
- II. REASONS NOT TO FUND AT FULL REQUEST
  - AR partners express frustration in communicating and working collaboratively with agency leadership
  - The review panel noted again, concern that case management was not integrated into I-HELP on site, clients are requested to make appointments and get to TCAA after being sheltered
  - Last year's conditions, shared verbally with agency staff, related to screening consistent with other homeless shelters, were not fulfilled
- III. OTHER RELEVANT COMMENTS
  - The review panel recommends coordination with other AR partners or shelters e.g. The Men's Shelter to accommodate clients who are turned away
  - The review panel recommends on-site supervision to alleviate problems with clients waiting to be selected for I-HELP, transportation to church sites and for clients who are not provided shelter services

### Conditions for Funding in FY 13/14:

- The review panel recommends screening, during the in-take process consistent with practices followed by other nonprofit homeless service providers supported with government funding
- The review panel recommends that case management be available to clients at sites during the evenings
- The review panel recommends that TCC and TCAA agree to a timeline to implement these recommendations, prior to FY 13/14 funding
- The review panel recommends that failure to comply result in quarterly checks to TCAA being delayed or withdrawn
