To the Tempe Community-at-Large:

For over 31 years, Tempe Community Council (TCC) has partnered with the City of Tempe to connect those in need with those who care. One of the most public roles of TCC has been to distribute human services funds on behalf of the City of Tempe. This year, it has been our privilege to co-chair the well-regarded grant program known as Agency Review.

Agency Review process was developed with the goal of being a community-driven process that is fair, transparent, accountable, and defendable. For Fiscal Year 2016/17, 46 volunteers dedicated an estimated 20 hours each, over a three-month period, to read human service proposals, evaluate them, interview those agencies and make funding recommendations to the City Council. We are extremely proud that Tempe leads its peer communities by having such a high level of involvement of its citizenry in this process each year.

Agency Review funds come from the City of Tempe General Revenue Fund, Federal Community Development Block Grants, and water utility customer donations through Tempe's Help to Others. The total funds recommended for distribution this year are close to \$736,000, for 40 agencies with 52 programs serving Tempeans in need. Those services include programs for our youth, seniors, those with disabilities, the working poor, survivors of domestic violence, and the homeless.

We would like to thank all of the volunteers who dedicated their time and valuable insight to this process, as well as the TCC staff who assembled all of the information and coordinated the process. Together we make an impact. Together we continue to connect those in need with those who care.



SUGGESTIONS FOR CHANGES TO THE AGENCY REVIEW PROCESS

- Reminder emails for doing the review. I know it's silly, we're all adults, but I procrastinated a lot thinking I had time. A countdown email probably would've inspired me.
- To give more importance to the community needs, I recommend a 33.3 percent x 3 split, or 35 for the application, 35 for the interview and 30 percent for community need, instead of the current 40-40-20 split.
- Maybe make a training webinar available. I have limited time outside work and kids, so a webinar might make the training more accessible.
- Just the suggestions that was mentioned at the last review.
- Spend time at the training sharing the final process for recommendations. Attending this final meeting helped me fine tune my thought process as I evaluated applications and interviews.
- It would be helpful to the volutneers especially the new ones to train them to understand how the final consensus process works so they understand that as they do the evaluations.
- First time and a great process.

Agency Review Application Scoring Rubric

There are three (3) scoring factors to help reviewers determine funding recommendations: proposal score, interview score, human services survey ranking score.

Scoring Guidelines:

- Excellent (5 points) Answers are clearly stated, specific, and comprehensive. The argument in the proposal is thoroughly developed, provides details, identifies outcome measures and the exact strategies to achieve them.
- Good (4 points) Answers are good but may lack some specificity. The applicant organization addresses the majority of the questions.
- Average (3 points) Most answers are acceptable but may lack specificity.
 Answers are not comprehensive and there may be minor inconsistencies or weaknesses.
- Fair (2 points) Answers are marginal The applicant organization does not explicitly address the majority of questions. There is minimal detail and insufficient descriptions that do not completely answer questions.
- Poor (1 point) Answers are unacceptable. The applicant does not explicitly address the questions.
 Applicant does not elaborate on responses or skipped/ignored questions.
 The answer is deficient in addressing the question.
