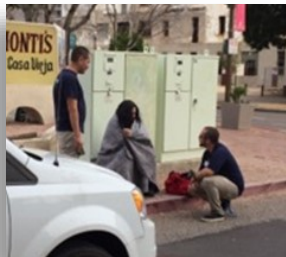

EAST VALLEY MEN'S SHELTER

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Offers single men from Tempe, who are homeless, the opportunity to recover their lives in a safe and supportive shelter environment.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Reduce the number of homeless men living on the streets or other hazardous environments in our community.
- Increase the number of homeless men who obtain stable housing, employment/income, and the necessary resources to maintain stability.
- Decrease the number of previously homeless men, who experience a reoccurrence of homelessness.

AGENCY INFORMATION

A New Leaf, Inc. is a Joint Commission accredited, 501(c)(3) organization committed to its mission of "Helping Families...Changing Lives." Since 1971, the agency has provided vital behavioral health and social services in Maricopa County. Through this mission, A New Leaf provides Maricopa County and surrounding area residents with diverse programs and services including domestic violence and homeless shelters and services, affordable and supportive housing, foster care and adoption services, behavioral health programs, youth residential programs and community programs including advocacy, financial literacy, IDA and work force development. During FY 18-19, over 27,000 individuals in need participated in A New Leaf's continuum of services.

SERVICES OFFERED

The East Valley Men's Center offers a wide range of supportive services including provision of food and clothing, case management, workforce development, life skills education/training, financial literacy, a mandatory savings program, referrals to behavioral health counseling and AA/NA support groups, legal aid, GED preparation, adult literacy, and asset building.

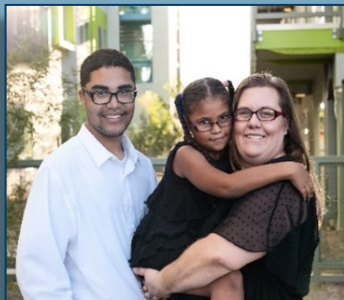

LA MESITA FAMILY HOMELESS SHELTER

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides emergency shelter and comprehensive support services to help homeless families transition from crisis to stability. Services include family case management, benefits enrollment, workforce development, educational endeavors, GED assistance and continuing education, housing navigation/rapid re-housing, and nutrition/cooking classes. Children's services include case management with a focus on truancy and behavioral needs, as well as an onsite afterschool program for K-8th graders. Offers community resource referrals for substance abuse counseling, parenting assistance, healthcare including mental health, and new home purchases.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Reduce the number of homeless families living on the streets or other hazardous environments in our community.
- Increase the number of homeless families who obtain stable housing, employment/income, and the necessary resources to maintain stability.
- Decrease the number of previously homeless families, who experience a reoccurrence of homelessness.

AGENCY INFORMATION

A New Leaf, Inc. is a Joint Commission accredited, 501(c)(3) organization committed to its mission of "Helping Families...Changing Lives." Since 1971, the agency has provided vital behavioral health and social services in Maricopa County. A New Leaf's La Mesita Family Homeless Shelter is a 16-unit family shelter providing a broad array of services to help homeless families with minor aged children become self-reliant. It is the only shelter in the East Valley that allows parents to bring their children with them.

SERVICES OFFERED

Domestic violence and homeless shelters, affordable and permanent supportive housing, rapid re-housing, advocacy programs, Individual Development Accounts, Community Action Program, foster care/adoption services, behavioral health services, youth residential services, workforce and business development, financial literacy, and early childhood education.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Reduce the number of homeless families living on the streets or other hazardous environments in our community.
- Increase the number of homeless families who obtain stable housing, employment/income, and the necessary resources to maintain stability.
- Decrease the number of previously homeless families, who experience a reoccurrence of homelessness.

ADVOCACY31NINE

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Advocating for the educational success for children impacted by foster care in Arizona and reducing the school to prison pipeline.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Support and empower caregivers (including working poor families) to work with schools for the child in foster care through 1:1 advocacy services.
- Train and equip a 10 volunteer cohort of special education advocates who can go with parents to meetings and advocate for support the children in foster care need.
- Equip caregivers with tools and understanding to navigate the special education process and obtain supports available through special education.
- Train and educate foster parents, school personnel, foster care agencies, and community agencies on how trauma impacts learning.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Advocacy31nine advocates for children in foster care by:

- Training caregivers on how to access support through the special education system and behavioral health system.
- Providing individual advocates to attend school meetings, review evaluations, and work collaboratively with school teams and foster families to meet the unique needs of children in foster care needing special education services.
- Advocating for systemic change in the systems that serve children in foster care, such as public school, the Department of Education, Department of Child Safety, and the juvenile court system.

SERVICES OFFERED

Training for caregivers, volunteer advocates, foster parents, school personnel, etc.

IMPACT - EDUCATING MALE PARTICIPANTS ON ACCOUNTABILITY CONTROL & TYPES OF ABUSE

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The EMPACT program is designed specifically for men who have been affected by domestic violence, with little to no income. Clients must provide proof of income, proof of identify, and if an individual is court mandated, they must provide court documents.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Educate men on domestic violence by explaining the different types of abuse
- Improve the behavior of men affected by domestic violence
- Educate men on finances and budgeting

AGENCY INFORMATION

The mission of Agnes' Centers for Domestic Solutions is to aid and assist individuals and families affected by domestic violence. The Center has programs and services that focus on empowering the victims and educating the perpetrators who are ready to end the cycle of abuse in their lives. Agnes' trained, educated, and professional staff addresses everyone's needs as they progress through the programs.

HOME CARE PROGRAM

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Delivers homemaking, personal care, and/or attendant care services to older adults and individuals 18+ with disabilities. These in-home services support individuals that need extra assistance in completing everyday tasks that have become difficult or unsafe to perform alone.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Help empower older adults and adults with disabilities to remain at home as long as possible.
- Help clients avoid costly and unwanted placement in a care facility by promoting safety and sanitary living conditions.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Area Agency on Aging, Region One is a private non-profit organization that advocates, develops and delivers essential services to enhance the quality of life for older adults, persons with disabilities, people with HIV/AIDS and caregivers.

SERVICES OFFERED

- Homemaking services – e.g., laundry, vacuuming, sweeping/mopping floors, and cleaning the bathroom
- Personal care services – e.g., assistance with bathing
- Attendant care services – the combination of homemaking and personal care that allows for more customization to the individual's changing needs

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Helps Tempe seniors remain independent by providing: individualized in-home assessments to identify strengths and needs; resource navigation to connect seniors and their families with benefits, health care, housing alternatives, transportation options, and other community services; chronic disease self-management education; and, in-home support services including respite, housekeeping, and personal care.

PROGRAM GOAL

Enable vulnerable older adults to maintain their independence in their own homes, delaying placement in assisted living or long-term care facilities.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides Dementia Friendly Action team to host a weekly Memory Café, monthly lecture series, dementia awareness and education programs (Dementia Friends) and an annual summit for Tempe residents affected by, caring for or providing services to those with Alzheimer's and dementia-related diseases.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Coordinate volunteers, life enrichment programs, events and activities for persons with memory loss and their caregivers
- Expand awareness, information, programs and resources to people and families in Tempe living with dementia to assist their unique needs, increasing the quality of life for individuals with Alzheimer's and their care partners.
- Increase participation of Dementia Friendly Tempe activities for Tempe residents living with dementia and their care partners.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Banner Alzheimer's Foundation secures charitable contributions to advance the mission of Banner Alzheimer's Institute (BAI). Established in 2006 by the nonprofit Banner Health, the Foundation supports the Institute as it strives to implement an innovative model of care for patients with Alzheimer's disease/dementia and their families which goes beyond traditional medicine to offer support for critical non-medical needs. Dementia Friendly America is a national initiative created by the White House Conference on Aging. BAI is in partnership with the City of Tempe to develop a Dementia Friendly program for the City of Tempe who was designated as one of five Dementia Friendly Communities in the United States.

SERVICES OFFERED

Weekly Memory Café, monthly lecture series, dementia awareness and education program (Dementia Friends) and an annual summit providing a helpline/information and referral, family care consultation, support groups, education program, safety services, and early stage programs.

CITY OF TEMPE FRIENDSHIP PROGRAM

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Best Buddies will continue to provide inclusion programs to students attending Tempe schools and to adults receiving services from The Arc of Tempe through a partnership with Arizona State University. The program is offered in six Tempe schools.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Promote one-to-one friendship opportunities between participants with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).
- Develop leadership skills among participants with IDD and typical peers so that they can lead the inclusion movement.
- Transform attitudes about the needs and abilities of people with IDD through program participation.
- Develop social skills among participants with IDD that aid in their employment, independence, and community integration.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Best Buddies International is a nonprofit organization dedicated to establishing a global volunteer movement that creates opportunities for one-to-one friendships, integrated employment and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. In 2000, Best Buddies International opened its Arizona state office in Phoenix, but initially began providing programmatic services in Tempe in 1994 with support from regional staff. Best Buddies goals are to provide people with IDD an opportunity for social integration and employment, while simultaneously raising public awareness for the inclusion of people with IDD.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides a safe place for young people, keeps them away from potentially unsafe or crisis situations and offers programs in three priority outcome areas: academic success, good character & citizenship, and healthy lifestyles.

PROGRAM GOALS

Encourage and support teen members to:

- participate in Club activities at least two or three days a week
- graduate from school with a plan for the future
- participate in physical activity at least five days a week
- participate in at least one Club or community volunteer activity annually
- abstain from at least two of the following within the past 30 days: drinking alcohol, smoking cigarettes/vaping, using illegal drugs, and being sexually active

AGENCY INFORMATION

The mission of Boys & Girls Clubs of the East Valley is to enable all young people, especially those most in need, to reach their full potential as productive, caring, responsible community members. Their intent is to assure success is within reach of every young person who enters their doors. Through structured, purposeful, and fun after-school and summer activities, all 11 of the Boys & Girls Clubs focus on five proven elements of positive youth development: build a safe, positive environment, establish supportive relationships, create fun, offer opportunities and provide recognition. Clubs are strategically located in low-income neighborhoods which have high rates of low educational achievement; crime, gang activity, and drug abuse; and teen pregnancy, because this is where they can reach and impact those who need Boys & Girls Clubs most.

TEMPE COMMUNITY BASED MENTORING PROGRAM

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Create and support one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of youth. The program guides high-risk, low-income children to become productive members of the community by learning from the positive examples set by professionally-trained mentors. The program provides both community (based on locations where they live) and site-based services (at Scales Technology Academy).

PROGRAM GOALS

- Increase one-to-one mentoring services for at-risk youth in Tempe.
- Increase self-confidence, academic outcomes, and school retention rates among at-risk Tempe youth.
- Decrease high-risk behaviors such as drug and alcohol use among Tempe youth as compared to their non-participating peer groups.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Big Brothers Big Sisters' of Central Arizona (BBSAZ) mission is to provide Arizona children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally supported, one-to-one mentoring relationships that change their lives for the better. BBBSAZ focuses solely on facilitating mentoring relationships between adults and at-risk youth in the community. They match children ("Littles"), ages 6-18, with caring, responsible adult mentors ("Bigs") who provide friendship, support, guidance, tutoring, and a fundamental basis of trust and compassion which so many of these children lack in their personal lives.

SERVICES OFFERED

- STARS - for children with an incarcerated parent; connects with positive role models
- Native American mentoring
- Big Futures SUCCESS: supplemental college and career readiness program
- LGBTQ mentoring

POSITIVE SOCIAL CHANGE THROUGH SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL)

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Casa partners with Tempe Elementary School District at Getz and Thrive to Five's Community Resource Center to provide Social Emotional Learning (SEL) in support of providing Tempe's youngest learners with tools to thrive in schools and in life. Tempe funds will provide a comprehensive approach to developing the emotional intelligence (EQ) of preschool learners to prepare them to be kindergarten ready and provide a foundation for their future success in school and workplace.

PROGRAM GOAL

Prepare Tempe's youngest residents to be successful in school and develop into contributing adult members of the community. To meet this goal, learners need to have the EQ to navigate life's complexities; starting with intentional SEL lessons at preschool and home.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Casa's mission is to teach children, teens and adults positive social and emotional intelligence and healthy relationship skills while reducing bullying, meanness and violence. Established in 1973 as the Center Against Sexual Assault, in 2012, Casa became the Center for Positive Social Change to emphasize its prevention services. Casa provides Social and Emotional Learning education to schools across Maricopa County and is currently part of a new national movement, SEL4US, to make SEL a standardized part of curriculum in pre-K-high school classrooms throughout Arizona.

SERVICES OFFERED

- Weekly evidence-based SEL programs
- Prevention programs: Kid's Talk - K-6 children program teaching personal boundaries and how to recognize and disclose if an adult violates their personal space; and POWER - "Positive Outcomes for Every Relationship" empowers middle and high school students to build healthy relations and self-esteem.
- Positive Discipline Association - teaching parenting with EQ

PROGRAM INFORMATION

A 30-bed shelter that offers home-like environment and supportive services for those fleeing violence.

PROGRAM GOAL

Transform victims into survivors and prepare them to lead safe, healthy lives. The program's mission is, "To assist survivors of domestic violence to physically heal and rebuild their lives free from abuse."

AGENCY INFORMATION

Catholic Charities' mission is to help the community's most vulnerable with solutions that permanently improve lives. Catholic Charities Community Services (CCCS) serves people of all faiths, backgrounds and abilities through 22 programs in 7 counties across central and northern Arizona. Their goals are to protect and nurture children, strengthen families, shelter individuals experiencing homelessness or abuse, support survivors of sex-trafficking, welcome refugees, provide affordable housing, empower veterans and support individuals living in poverty. Their family services include foster care, adoption, pregnancy counseling and early childhood education. CCCS is held to the highest standard of service through the Council on Accreditation and leverages partner agencies and resources to create the greatest impact possible in an effective, efficient manner.

TRANSPORTATION FOR LOW INCOME DEAF SENIORS

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Ensures affordable transportation is available for routine grocery shopping, pharmacy visits and banking. Valley Center of the Deaf (VCD) offers services in collaboration with the Tempe Neighbors Helping Neighbors Senior Van Program, to the residents of Apache ASL (American Sign Language) Trails, who are primarily seniors with an average age over 70, and who all have a disability.

PROGRAM GOAL

Improve overall health of residents and residential stability by providing transportation access to routine grocery, shopping and pharmacy trips; connecting to other senior programs and services through case management and maintaining independent living through in-home supports.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Valley Center of the Deaf's (VCD) organizational mission is to empower persons who are Deaf, Deaf-Blind, Hard-of-Hearing, or Late-Deafened to achieve maximal functional and economic independence through the removal of architectural, communication, attitudinal and accessibility barriers that prevent individuals who are Deaf, Deaf-Blind, Hard-of-Hearing, or Late-Deafened from achieving success and independence. Catholic Community Services' corporate mission statement is: "We strengthen children, adults, families and communities by providing help, creating hope and serving all."

Central Arizona Shelter Services



SHELTER SERVICES

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Central Arizona Shelter Services (CASS) serves Tempe individuals with over 2,000 bed nights at our downtown Phoenix adult shelter. Clients have all of their basic needs met, including a warm bed, food, clothing and hygiene. Importantly, clients are also engaged in personalized support and services, with the goal of helping them address barriers, build self-sufficiency and move into stable housing.

PROGRAM GOALS

CASS' most fundamental goal is to intervene quickly in individuals' experiences of homelessness by providing them with safety and addressing all of their basic needs. In addition to addressing clients' immediate needs, we aim to engage every client in the appropriate level of case management and services that can help permanently end their homelessness.

AGENCY INFORMATION

CASS is guided by their mission to empower men, women, and children with diverse needs to end their homelessness by providing shelter and supportive services. In 1984, community leaders came together to form CASS in response to a homelessness crisis in downtown Phoenix. Since then, CASS has developed a dental office for people experiencing homelessness, opened a family shelter, and played a lead role in the development of the Human Services Campus. CASS has grown in partnership with the community by listening to its needs and concerns and remains a trailblazer in homelessness services for the Phoenix Metro Area.

Homeward Bound was founded in 1990 by community activists who saw a need to provide housing to homeless families with children. Today HB is a family stabilization program with a housing component. Our two-generational approach simultaneously equips parents and kids with tools they need to thrive while removing obstacles in their way. HB provides services to 120 families annually. Parents access resources to achieve financial stability and learn how to emotionally support and advocate for their kids; while children receive high-quality childhood education and enrichment experiences. HB builds resiliency and stabilizes the entire family breaking the cycles of poverty and abuse that lead to homelessness and welfare dependency.

SERVICES OFFERED

Through a two-generational approach, children receive high-quality education and enrichment experiences, parents learn to emotionally support and advocate for their children, and parents access financial resources to increase family stability. Families receive a safe home, clothes, basic supplies, and food. Case Management is offered along with learning to budget, clear evictions, pay debts, and improve FICO scores. Adult clients must be employed or looking for work. Many program core classes and coaching address many of the root causes and effects of poverty: poor credit, low income, lack of education and job skills.

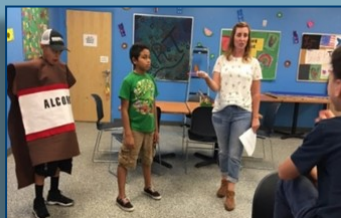

BUILDING RESILIENCY IN YOUTH

PROGRAM INFORMATION

School-based primary prevention program which offers practical skills for helping children learn how to think through and resolve everyday conflicts. TEMPE VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE (VITA) PROGRAM

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Free tax preparation services are provided in coordination with the Internal Revenue Service, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program for low to moderate-income taxpayers earning less than \$56,000. Tempe Community Council (TCC) extends this service to include seniors and disabilities regardless of income. Arizona State University international students are provided unique assistance in filing their non-resident tax returns. Asset educators are available on-site to identify asset development opportunities and assist with referrals.

PROGRAM GOAL

- Provide free tax preparation services and asset development opportunities to help hard working, low wage-earning taxpayers receive eligible tax credits and maximum their refund.
- Increase ability of individuals and families to become financially stable and self-sufficient by providing assistance to increase income, maintain financial stability, build savings and gain/sustain assets.

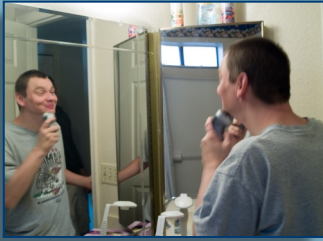

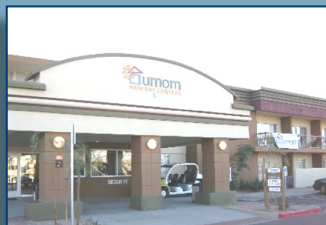

EMERGENCY SHELTER

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Programs and services provide help to Tempe families to become stabilized, so they can gain, obtain and maintain permanent housing. In addition to housing, each family will receive case management focused on individualized goals to help end their homelessness. UMOM's formula to success is housing + income = ending homelessness. This combined approach to housing and income sets up clients to self-resolve their homelessness than a traditional approach to shelter and housing that does not have an integrated workforce development component.

PROGRAM GOAL

End homelessness for the most vulnerable and at-risk households with children in Maricopa County. The target population is families with dependent children experiencing homelessness and all referrals are received through the Family Coordinated Entry System operated by UMOM.

AGENCY INFORMATION

YOUTH OUTREACH

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Identify, locate, and make human connection with Tempe-based homeless youth to provide basic essential living needs and resources to assist in ending their homelessness.

PROGRAM GOAL

- Collaborate with Tempe-based service providers to identify youth displaced from closing of the Tempe Youth Resource Center, including Tempe First United Methodist Church and Tempe Community Action Agency (TCAA) to inform the development and implementation of targeted outreach services to youth. Efforts include triage, safety planning, assessment and shelter referral.
- Youth Outreach and Engagement team will increase frequency of navigation services to all youth connected to TCAA's I-Help shelter.
- Due to closing of Phoenix Youth Resource Center in 2019, redirect efforts to coordinate regional youth outreach to identify youth who have migrated to the Human Services Campus and Halle Women's Center and connect them to services and other Tempe resources as appropriate.
