LA MESITA FAMILY HOMELESS SHELTER

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides emergency shelter and comprehensive support services to help homeless families transition from crisis to stability. Services include family case management, benefits enrollment, workforce development, educational endeavors, GED assistance and continuing education, housing navigation/rapid re-housing, and nutrition/cooking classes. Children's services include case management with a focus on truancy and behavioral needs, as well as an onsite afterschool program for K-8th graders. Offers community resource referrals for substance abuse counseling, parenting assistance, healthcare including mental health, and new home purchases.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Increase the number of homeless families who obtain stable housing, employment/income, and the necessary resources to maintain stability.
- Increase self-sufficiency and stability of families.
- Reduce the number of homeless families living on the streets or other hazardous environments in our community.

AGENCY INFORMATION

A New Leaf, Inc. is a Joint Commission accredited, 501(c)(3) organization committed to its mission of "Helping Families...Changing Lives." Since 1971, the agency has provided vital behavioral health and social services in Maricopa County. A New Leaf's La Mesita Family Homeless Shelter is a 16-unit family shelter providing a broad array of services to help homeless families with minor aged children become self-reliant. It is the only shelter in the East Valley that allows parents to bring their children with them.

- Help clients avoid costly and unwanted placement in a care facility by promoting safety and sanitary living conditions.
- Improve quality of life and increase social support while decreasing feelings of loneliness and social isolation.

CITY OF TEMPE FRIENDSHIP PROGRAM

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides opportunities for friendship and leadership development for students with and without intellectual/developmental disabilities (IDD). Inclusion programs are provided to students attending Tempe schools and to adults receiving services from The Arc of Tempe through a partnership with Arizona State University. The program is offered in six Tempe schools.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Promote one-to-one friendship opportunities between participants with and without intellectual and development disabilities (IDD).
- Develop leadership skills among participants with IDD and typical peers so that they can lead the inclusion movement.
- Transform attitudes about the needs and abilities of people with IDD through program participation.
- Develop social skills among participants with IDD that aid in their employment, independence, and community integration.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Best Buddies International is a nonprofit organization dedicated to establishing a global volunteer movement that creates opportunities for one -to-one friendships, integrated employment and leadership development for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

In 2000, Best Buddies International opened its Arizona state office in Phoenix, but initially began providing programmatic services in Tempe in 1994 with support from regional staff. Best Buddies goals are to provide people with IDD an opportunity for social integration and employment, while simultaneously raising public awareness for the inclusion of people with IDD.

TEMPE COMMUNITY BASED MENTORING PROGRAM

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Creates and supports one-to-one mentoring relationships that ignite the power and promise of Tempe youth. The program guides high-risk, low-income children to become productive members of the community by learning from the positive examples set by professionally-trained mentors.

PROGRAM GOALS

- Increase one-to-one mentoring services for at-risk youth in Tempe.
- Increase self-confidence, academic outcomes, and school retention rates among at-risk Tempe youth.
- Decrease high-risk behaviors such as drug and alcohol use among Tempe youth as compared to their non-participating peer groups.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Big Brothers Big Sisters' of Central Arizona (BBSAZ) mission is to provide Arizona children facing adversity with strong and enduring, professionally supported, one-to-one mentoring relationships that change their lives for the better. BBBSAZ focuses solely on facilitating mentoring relationships between adults and at-risk youth in the community. They match children ("Littles"), ages 6-18, with caring, responsible adult mentors ("Bigs") who provide friendship, support, guidance, tutoring, and a fundamental basis of trust and compassion which so many of these children lack in their personal lives.

SUPPORTING DEAF SENIORS

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Ensures affordable transportation is available for routine grocery shopping, pharmacy visits and banking. Valley Center of the Deaf (VCD) offers services in collaboration with the Tempe Neighbors Helping Neighbors Senior Van Program, to the residents of Apache ASL (American Sign Language) Trails, who are primarily seniors with an average age over 70, and who all have a disability.

PROGRAM GOAL

Improve overall health of residents and residential stability by providing transportation access to routine grocery, shopping and pharmacy trips; connecting to other senior programs and services through case management and maintaining independent living through in-home supports.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Valley Center for the Deaf's organizational mission is to empower persons who are Deaf, Deaf-Blind, Hard-of-Hearing, or Late-Deafened to achieve maximal functional and economic independence through the removal of architectural, communication, attitudinal and accessibility barriers that prevent these individuals from achieving success and independence. SHELTER AND SUPPORT SERVICES

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Serves Tempe individuals offering over 2,000 bed nights at their downtown Phoenix adult shelter. Clients have all of their basic needs met, including a warm bed, food, clothing and hygiene. Importantly, clients are also engaged in personalized support and services, with the goal of helping them address barriers, build self-sufficiency and move into stable housing.

PROGRAM GOALS

Central Arizona Shelter Services' (CASS) most fundamental goal is to intervene quickly in individuals' experiences of homelessness by providing them with safety and addressing all of their basic needs. In addition to addressing clients' immediate needs, we aim to engage every client in the appropriate level of case management and services that can help permanently end their homelessness.

AGENCY INFORMATION

CASS' mission is to prevent and end homelessness among individuals and families while advancing compassionate community solutions. Founded in 1984, CASS is Arizona's largest and longest serving emergency shelter program for individuals and families experiencing homelessness. In the 37 years since its founding, CASS has worked tirelessly to end homelessness by providing shelter, case management, and housing services to more than 150,000 community members.

Emergency shelter, case management, rapid re-housing assistance, one-time deposit assistance, access to resources, finance & budgeting, hygiene kits, clothing bank, employment training, move-out kits, childcare and job seeking.

CARING FOR HOMELESS CHILDREN

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Recruits, trains, licenses/certifies and monitors foster and adoptive homes (resource homes) for foster children from Maricopa County. Provides best-practice congregate facilities and longer-term care and stabilization with support for foster children and foster parents.

PROGRAM GOAL

- Children served in the Emergency Children's Shelter and Group Home will show improvement in medical health.
- Children placed in Child Crisis Arizona affiliated foster homes will experience stability of placement.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Child Crisis Arizona exists to provide children and youth in Arizona a safe environment, free from abuse and neglect, by creating strong and successful families. Their vision for the community is "Safe Kids. Strong Families." Their work falls into three general areas: child abuse prevention, intervention when child abuse or neglect has occurred, and early childhood education.

Prevention services include the Family Education Program designed to increase parenting skills, build strong families, and reduce the possibility of child abuse or neglect. Intervention services are Emergency Children's Placement Services comprised of the Emergency Children's Shelter and Foster Care and Adoption. Early Education services includes two Early Head Start programs (one in Phoenix and the other in Mesa) and a preschool located on their Phoenix campus.

VICTIM SERVICES

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Offers crisis shelter, outpatient counseling, transitional housing, victim advocacy, legal advocacy, a crisis hotline, and an offender treatment program.

PROGRAM GOAL

- Provide broad-based solutions to prevent domestic abuse
- Address homelessness due to domestic violence
- Maintain low barriers for program participation
- Increase safety of victims and their children
- Teach victims how to plan for their continued safety;
- Educate victims about domestic violence and its short and long-term impact
- Provide assistance with Orders of Protection
- Offer information related to victim rights and victim compensation
- Help victims (re)gain control of their lives
- Encourage victims to set and meet goals in order to become selfsufficient
- Increase victims' ability to cope and sense of well-being
- Educate victims about community-based resources specific to their needs
- Assist victims in increasing their income and securing permanent housing

AGENCY INFORMATION

Leads community to broad-based solutions to prevent domestic abuse.

SERVICES OFFERED

Chrysalis provides a victim services program comprised of emergency shelter, transitional housing, outpatient counseling, and victim advocacy. In addition, Chrysalis provides a 24/7/365 day a year crisis hotline, as well as community education presentations on domestic abuse. In addition to victim services Chrysalis also offers an offender treatment program.

EAST VALLEY NEIGHBORHOOD PARTNERSHIP

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides mobile medical services in Tempe and Mesa. The outreach model of healthcare delivery is designed to bridge care to the hardest to reach and most-marginalized homeless populations. The East Valley Neighborhood Partnership (EVNP) mobile medical clinic strives to reduce economic, geographic, and psychosocial barriers to care in an accessible and welcoming way for those who are either unable or unwilling to access fixed-site clinics.

PROGRAM GOAL

Improve patient health outcomes and provide:

- Integrated primary healthcare services to an under-served/homeless population of patients (individuals and families) who would otherwise rely on hospital emergency department visits for routine or non-emergent medical care.
- Case management services and assisting patients with connections to community resources that will help with enrollment in AHCCCS, SSI, SSDI, and housing.
- Medical services and street outreach services to ensure an integrated model of care that addresses behavioral health and substance abuse issues.

TRAUMA INFORMED PRIMARY PREVENTION (TIPP)

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provide a year-round positive youth development and leadership program designed with evidence-based strategies. Activities are led by trained peer educators at local high schools, middle schools and community centers.

PROGRAM GOAL

- Redirect resources spent on crisis intervention to investing in the health and well-being of families and communities.
- Address and prevent Adverse Childhood Experience (ACEs) by interrupting the cycle of harm and modifying societal norms and policies to permanently create stable and nurturing environments.
- Include youth in the development and facilitation of intergenerational, evidence-based strategies inclusive of individuals with all abilities.
- Address trauma with empathy, kindness, non-judgement and compassion.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Peer Solution's mission is "Kids teaching kids to make the world a better place." Their vision is a world where everyone is safe and treated equitably, with respect (SER). This is a world free from harm to self, others, animals and the planet. Peer Solutions offer a Trauma Informed Primary Prevention (TIPP) model, designed to redirect resources spent on crisis intervention to investing in the health and well-being of families, schools, workplaces, governments and communities. They serve nine schools weekly in Central and South Phoenix and Tempe, Arizona with 15 sites on a waiting list and support programming in South Dakota and Washington State.

For example: individuals with neural tube defects, cerebral palsy, seizure disorders, Down syndrome, cognitive delays, and autism. Each person faces different challenges; for example: the ability to make decisions, mobility and range of motion limitations, and communication barriers. TCH provides a variety of services for individuals with disabilities to live a full and independent life.

SERVICES OFFERED

- Day program that serves up to 120 people
- Group homes where over 60 people have a home
- In-home services to over 100 people in their homes
- Employment programs that provides support for successful employment for over 200 individuals, and transportation for all activities providing an average of 2,500 passenger trips monthly

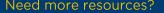

FAMILY EMERGENCY SHELTER

PROGRAM INFORMATION

Provides help to Tempe families to become stabilized, so they can gain, obtain and maintain permanent housing. In addition to housing, each family will receive case management focused on individuated goals to help end their homelessness. UMOM's formula to success is housing + income = ending homelessness. This combined approach sets up clients to self-resolve their homelessness than a traditional approach to shelter and housing that does not have an integrated workforce development component.

PROGRAM GOAL

- 75% of emergency shelter clients will exit to permanent housing.
- 90% of adults will be connected to mainstream benefits in their community at program exit.
- 60% of adults will maintain or increase total income at program exit (earned income plus other income sources).
- Average length of stay in shelter = 120 days or less.

AGENCY INFORMATION

Founded in 1964, UMOM is Arizona's largest provider of services for families experiencing homelessness. Their mission is to prevent and end homelessness with innovative strategies and housing solutions that meet the unique needs of each family and individual. UMOM serves over 18,000 individuals across their services annually, including those families receiving support at the Family Housing Hub, Maricopa County's family coordinated entry system. UMOM believes everyone deserves the opportunity for a better life. They do not manage homelessness: they end homelessness.

SERVICES OFFERED

Families residing at UMOM, are provided intensive individualized client support including 1-on-1 case management; employment services to secure and maintain employment; advocacy with property management companies, landlords, courts, and partnering agencies; and connection to community resources. While residing in shelter, all family members have access to additional services including food, medical care, and childcare.

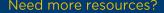
