Tempe Community Council will honor Sharon Doyle as the 41st recipient of the prestigious Don Carlos Humanitarian Award. Since 1984, this award has recognized exceptional individuals who have demonstrated outstanding dedication to improving the lives of others and who embody the spirit of compassion and service within the Tempe community. The award is named after Tempe's founder, Charles Trumbull Hayden, affectionately known by Hispanic pioneers as "Don Carlos." Charles devoted his life to helping those in need, and the Don Carlos Humanitarian Award reflects his enduring legacy. Recipients of this award are true humanitarians who have significantly contributed to making Tempe a better place for everyone.

Throughout her life, Sharon has demonstrated a legacy of selfless dedication to human services through her longtime volunteer work with TCC as well as multiple other organizations and causes. Sharon has been a member of the TCC Board of Directors, chaired the Youth and Families Board Committee for many years, and is currently Chair of the Tempe Coalition. In addition to her work for TCC, Sharon has played a major role in the Tempe Impacts Education (TIE) Foundation, the Kiwanis Club of Tempe, and Tempe Sister Cities. She has dedicated countless hours to multiple humanitarian efforts, including youth programs, substance abuse prevention, public education, and sustaining community vitality.

Congratulations to Sharon Doyle and thank you for your service to the Tempe community.

Did You Know? TCC Volunteer Becomes Points of Light Recipient





Kathy Stevens became the <u>7,826th Points of Light awardee</u> on June 4th for her longtime involvement with our Threadz teen clothes closet program. Kathy has been at the forefront of this pivotal initiative, which has aimed to ensure that all students have the resources they need to attend and graduate from high school since its founding in 2009. She helped to establish the first site at Tempe High School and continues to volunteer there today.

Kathy's dedication is evident in her more than 1,000 hours of volunteer service, which have contributed significantly to the program's success and efficiency. Kathy says her favorite part of being a Threadz volunteer is interacting with the students. She is impressed by them, finding them to be smart, funny, kind, and full of promise. TCC staff say Kathy is not only a committed volunteer but also a champion of the program within the community.

The Points of Light Award was founded in 1989 by President George H.W. Bush. President Bush honored 1,000 volunteers across the country for demonstrating how a "neighbor can help a neighbor." Now, an awardee is featured each day to celebrate the power of individuals to lead and lend support to causes they care about, making a change in their community.

Kathy Stevens also received a Mayoral proclamation on June 27 at the Tempe City Council meeting. The proclamation highlighted her Points of Light award and her service to the city of Tempe. **Thanks Kathy for all you do!**


During adolescence, teens seek greater independence and responsibility, while also encountering a variety of conflicting views and influences from peers, teachers, parents, and the media. The temptation to engage in risky behaviors that could impact their health or future is significant.

Tempe Coalition Preventing Underage Drinking and Drug Use

The **Tempe Coalition to Reduce Underage Drinking and Drug Use** as been dedicated to addressing substance misuse in our community since 2009, evolving from earlier efforts that began in 1996.

A program of Tempe Community Council, the Coalition is funded by federal and state grants and includes local residents and professionals committed to reducing risky behaviors among youth.

With a diverse membership representing businesses, law enforcement, schools, and healthcare, the Coalition leads impactful initiatives like "ShatterStigmaAZ" to combat the opioid epidemic.

The Coalition also offers prevention programs on topics such as fentanyl, marijuana, vaping, alcohol misuse, and internet safety, along with Narcan training and distribution.

To be eligible, all service or actions must directly impact or serve youth who live, work, or attend school within Tempe school district boundaries (Tempe Elementary, Kyrene, Tempe Union High School District), including public, private, and charter schools.
